**CPSP 359G SGC Practicum (Scholarship in Practice)
Science & Global Change Practicum Project Timeline
Due Online May 10 (that's the last day of class!), 2022**

This assignment is to document the process it took to complete the project. It is ***NOT*** the same thing as the Time Sheet (which documented the completion of the hours). It is instead an outline of how your project unfolded over the course of time.

Your report must be entered in the appropriate text box in ELMS. (We suggest you write it in Word or other word processor, then cut-&-paste onto ELMS.)

For the Timeline, indicate the dates and durations of your project or service. If you did different tasks in different weeks, indicate what you did when.

Here is an example. However, your format may vary so long as you cover the issue of describing how your project or service worked over time. An alternative to the format below is to list the tasks and indicate how long each of those took, and when you did them.

Weeks One-Two (September 4-17): Researched possibility of reanimating dead tissue: worked primarily in library. Focused on issues of galvanic motivation of bodies.

Weeks Three-Six (September 18-October 29): Set up laboratory. Acquired surgical table, shackles, Van De Graff generators, monitors, wire, assorted chemicals, glassware, pulley system, lightning rods, kite. Installed door on roof. Wired laboratory.

Weeks Seven-Nine (October 30-November 19): Assessed potential specimens; acquired said specimens from cemeteries (with aid of Igor).

Week Ten (November 20-26): Sutured together test subject. (Took Thanksgiving Day off).

Weeks Eleven-Twelve (November 27-December 10): Waited for Thunderstorm. No luck.

December 13: Thunderstorm. Animated specimen

Week Thirteen (December 14-17): Observed specimen as it learned to walk, eat, speak.

Weeks Fourteen-Sixteen (December 18-January 7): Specimen escaped. Spent several weeks searching for specimen; examined police reports and rumors on social media.

January 9: Specimen returned

Week Seventeen (January 10-14): Specimen now demanding to have name, rights, respect. Researching how to create legal identity for a resurrected combination of once-dead body parts.

Week Eighteen-Nineteen (January 15-29): Coordinate with public relations firm for announcement of discovery. Rent theatre. Print out and distribute announcement posters and fliers.

January 30: Revealed creation to world
