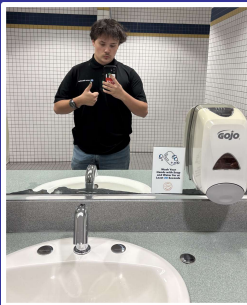
Where Did You Teach?
